	Free Kick (Wide)	Free Kick (Central)	Corner Kick (Short)	Corner Kick (Long)
Organization and behavior (collective and individual): positioning? Man marking or zonal marking?	6 players stand outside the 18-yard box, right about where the defense creates their line. 3 players are getting ready for the counter. The last player is short, in case there's a possibility of quick pass.	6 players stand outside the 18-yard box, right about where the defense creates their line. 2 players are getting ready for the counter. The #5 who's the regular free-kick taker, will just take a shot on goal.	Again, the #5 takes the kick. There's always a free player, just in case they want to play a short ball. Normally even on a short ball, they try to play a cross into the box.	With the center back taking the kick, there's a player or decoy in order to take a defender or two outside of the box. They look to play in the "red-zone", in order to at least have a chance at goal.
How many and which players are assigned to marking?	Germany man-marked outside the box, with 2/3 players watching for a short pass. Those players also served in case there were options for counterattacks.	Germany defends with 2 purpose of man-marking the most dangerous players and to not get beat in the air. They 2/3 players free in order to strictly play the ball.	Germany defends with everyone in the box, except 2/3 players. Those 2/3 players (2 forwards and a midfielder) mark the space and any short players.	Germany put all 1 or 2 players in the box. They start close to the keeper and look to push the ball up and out.

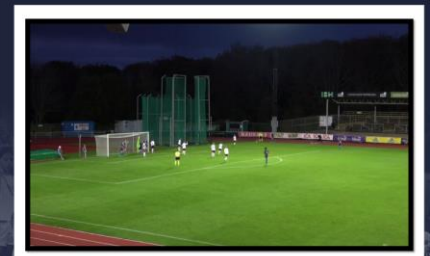

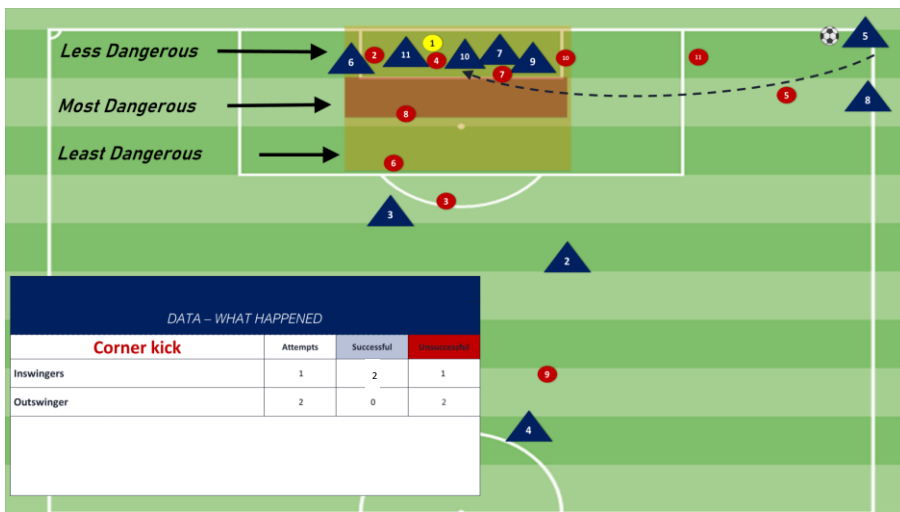
